- Preparing legal documents, particularly language used in legal documents
- The role of Services providers in various legal processes (Guardianship, Restoration, Adoption), and what documents Service Providers need to provide to the court

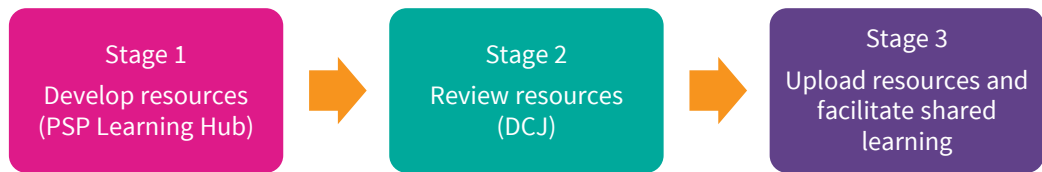

We understand that to add value to your work these resources and shared learning need to be quality.

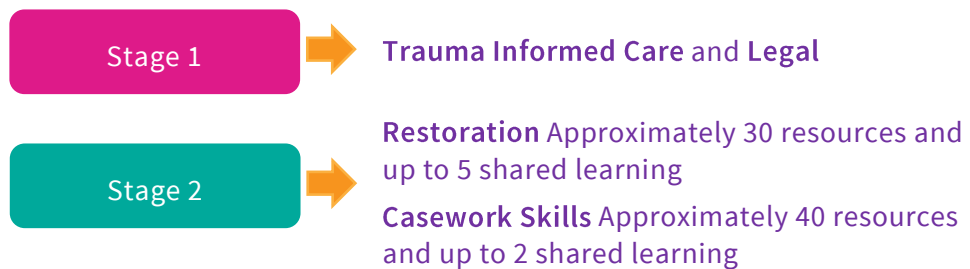
