

## **Case Planning and Assessment**

**Overview of Responsibilities** 

Case planning and assessment are inter-related processes. For example, the outcome of a safety and risk assessment will influence Family Action Plan goals and progress towards Family Action Plan goals will impact a restoration assessment. Similarly, a child's OOHC case plan will inform parts of a Care Plan, and a Care Plan's permanency planning will inform case planning.

Under the PSP the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) and PSP service providers have complementary roles in case planning and assessment. It can be difficult to keep track of what needs to be done, who needs to do it and when it needs to be done by. The requirements are different depending on the child's permanency goal.

The following table provides an overview of:

- timeframes for the review of case plans
- timeframes for assessments required under the PSP •
- who is responsible for conducting the reviews or assessments.
