It is important as caseworkers to start preparation and planning much earlier for young people in care. Leaving care planning is not an administrative tick-a-box! Good preparation begins early to consider the skills, capacity and needs of young people as they transition towards adulthood. Get in early with discussions and consider ways to grow skills (like budget and saving,

cooking, and understanding tax and banking) and opportunities for social inclusion such


