PSP Implementation Meetings

We attended five implementation meetings this last month and heard from the sector's leaders, about their priorities. It was a timely opportunity to connect leaders with our newly released training and resources on case planning.

June Working group - Working with Aboriginal Children Young People and Families

Every month the PSP Learning Hub holds a practice area working group, bringing together the unique voices in the sector to help inform resources, training and shared learning that supports all PSP caseworkers.

In June we had the working with Aboriginal children, young people and families working group.

17 PSP service providers attended the working group, with a total of 90% Aboriginal representation.

There was strong agreement between participants on the need for a different set of skills and knowledge to best serve the interests of Aboriginal children.

Some examples of the specific skills and knowledge discussed include, how to:

- enact the Aboriginal Placement Principles
- improve outcomes in family led decision making with knowledge of intergenerational trauma
- action culturally appropriate assessment
- consider language e.g. the impact of child protection language on elders
- family finding
